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# 1. Introduce

Thank you for purchasing the Single-Tuner Ready Personal Video Recorder (PVR).

This PVR is fully compliant with the international DVB standard and thus transmits digital images, sounds, information guides and teletext directly to your TV through the satellite broadcasting Now you can comfortably see and receive digitally transmitted music, news, movie and sports satellite broadcasts in your office or at your home. The PVR records and plays back satellite broadcasts. In the service search section, both the automatic service search method and the manual search mode are provided. Also it supports DiSEqC 1.0, 1.1, 1.2 and USALS, enabling you to move your antenna in order to focus preferred satellite. You can save up to 10000 TV and Radio services and work around with Favorite, Sort, Move, Lock, Delete, Rename functions.

The menu is very modern and supports multiple languages. All functions can be carried out using the remote control. The PVR is easy to use and adaptable for future advances. Please be aware that new software may change the functions of the PVR.

If you have any difficulties concerning the operation of your PVR, please refer to the relevant section of this manual. This manual provide you with useful information on using the PVR

# 2. Overview

# 2.1 The front of the digital receiver



#### 1. Button

Power Key: To Switch the receiver power on/stand by.
Up / Down Key: To change channels, or to move cursor up or down in the menu.

#### 2. VDF Display

This VFD display will show the current channel number or current time. While the receiver is in stand by mode, the display will show the current time.

#### 3. Remote Sensor

This sensor receives the infrared signal from the Remote Control Unit and operates your receiver. Do not block the view of the sensor.


#### 4. Card Slot

One slot CA Interface, Insert the smart card chip side down.

#### 5. Common Interface

Two socket for Conditional Access Module CAM.

# 2.2 The back of the digital receiver



#### 1. TV SCART

Audio and video output socket for the television set.

#### 2. Y/Pb/Pr

Component video output socket for the television set. (green/blue/red)

#### 3. VIDEO

Composite video output socket for the television set. (yellow)

#### 4. AUDIO L/R

Stereo audio output socket for the television set or the audio system. (white/red)

#### 5. LNB IN

Satellite broadcasting signal input socket.

#### 6. LNB OUT

Satellite broadcasting signal output socket through the LNB IN socket for another digital receiver.

#### 7. S/PDIF

Dolby digital output socket for the audio system.


#### 8. USB

USB port for firmware update and data transfer.

#### 9. HDMI

Audio and video output socket for the high definition television set.

# 2.3 The RCU-320 Remote Control Unit



#### 01. STANDBY

Switches between operation and standby modes.

#### 02. MUTE

Mutes or unmutes the audio temporarily.

#### 03. SLEEP

Sets the sleep timer.

#### 04. V-FORMAT

Changes the resolution of video.

#### 05. AUDIO

Used to select alternative audio track and audio channel (stereo, mono, etc).

#### 06. TIME

Displays the current time.

# 07. NUMERICAL BUTTONS (0~9)

Used to enter a service number for service change or to specify values for menu options.

#### 08. SUBTITLE

Displays the subtitle language list.

### 09. TELETEXT (TTX)

Enters the digital text service.

#### 10. RECALL

Switches between the current service and the previously viewed one.

#### 11. OPTION

Is used to select a video track of multi-feed program.

#### 12. PAGE UP / DOWN

Is used to change the page.

#### **13. MENU**

Displays the main menu. It is also used to return to the previous menu from a submenu.

#### 14. EXIT

Is used to exit the current screen.

#### 15. **◄/▶** (LEFT/RIGHT)

Changes the volume or move the cursor to the left or right menu option.

#### 16. **▲**/▼ (UP/DOWN)

Changes the channel or move the cursor to the up, down menu option.

#### 17. OK

Displays the services list. It is also used to select a menu item.

#### 18. INFO

Displays the service information box. It is also used to display more information about a program.

#### 19. GUIDE

GUIDE displays the electronic program guide.

#### 20. TV/RADIO

Switches between television services and radio services.

#### 21. FAV

Displays the Favorite list.

#### 22. COLOR KEY (RED, GREEN, YELLOW, BLUE)

Select the color keys for interactive applications.

#### 23. VOL UP/DOWN

Changes the volume level in the Non-menu state.

#### 24. CH UP/DOWN

Changes channels in Non-menu state.

#### 25. RECORD LIST

Is used to display the list of recorded programs that are stored on the external hard disk drive.

#### 26. RECORD

Is used to start recording.

#### 27. BOOK MARK

In used to set a bookmark.

#### 28. BOOK MARK LIST

Displays the list of saved bookmarks.

#### 29. REPEAT

In used to set a repeat position.

#### 30. REWIND

Is used to start reverse playback. Subsequent presses increase the rewind speed.

#### **31. PLAY**

Play at normal speed or resume.

#### 32. FAST FORWARD

Is used to start fast motion playback. Subsequent presses increase the playback speed.

#### **33. STOP**

Is used to stop playback, to stop recording, or to jump back to live television from time-shifted television.

#### 34. PAUSE

Pauses playback of a recorded program or time shift.

#### 35. SLOW MOTION

Plays the program in slow motion. Each time you press this button, speed is slowed progressively more.

# 3. Connection and Preparation

This chapter describes how to set up the receiver. Select the most appropriate procedure depending on your requirements.

#### Note >>>

If you encounter any problem when setting up your receiver, please contact your local receiver distributor.

# 3.1 Connecting the satellite antenna

Connect the cable from the satellite dish to the LNB IN on the receiver.

# 3.2 Connection to your television set

Between all the following connectors of the digital receiver, we recommend you to use the first connector to get best picture quality, If your television does not have the matching connector, the use the next connector in the following order for better picture quality.

#### Note >>>

- 1. HDMI connector ( HDMI )
- 3. Component connector (Y/Pb/Pr)
- 2. SCART connector (TV SCART)
- 4. Composite connector (VIDEO)

# 3.3 Connecting the mains cable

Plug the mains cable into the wall socket.

# 3.4 Inserting batteries in the remote control

To insert the batteries, open the battery compartment by removing the lid, and then insert the batteries observing the polarity, which is marked on the base of the battery compartment.

If the digital receiver no longer reacts properly to remote control commands, the batteries may be flat. Be sure to remove used batteries. The manufacturer accepts no liability for damage resulting from leaking batteries.

#### Environmental note >>>

Batteries, including those which contain no heavy metals, may not be disposed of with household waste. Please dispose of used batteries in an environmentally sound manner. Find out about the legal regulations which apply in your area.

# 4. Installation Wizard Settings

When powering on your receiver for the first time after purchasing, the Installation Wizard is automatically started.

You can easily set-up using simple organization and options, and watch the broadcasting after completing the set-up procedure.

You can move items using the  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  buttons and select items using the OK button.

#### Note >>>

If you press the EXIT button while running the Installation Wizard, you can return to the previous screen.

# 4.1 Languages



You can select menu language.

Select the appropriate language from the list using the  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  buttons and press the OK button to save the selected language as a default language.

#### Note >>>

The display language could be different according to country.

# 4.2 Setting



Setting allows you to set the Country, Display Format, Resolution (Video Format), TV SCART, Audio Language, Quick Installation and Search.

# 4.2.1 Country

- You can select country.
  - 1. Select Country using the ▲/▼ buttons.
  - 2. Select your desired area using ◀/▶ button, or press the OK button to display the available list.
  - 3. When you press the OK button, Select your desired area using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK button.

# 4.2.2 Display Format

- You can set the Display Format of your TV
  - 1. Select Display Format using the ▲/▼buttons.
  - 2. Select 4:3 or 16:9 using **◄/▶** Button.

# 4.2.3 Resolution (Video Format)

- You can select Resolution (Video Format).
  - 1. Select Resolution (Video Format) using the ▲/▼ buttons.
  - 2. Select your desired Resolution (Video Format) using **◄/▶** button, or press the OK button to display the available list.
  - 3. When you press the OK button, Select your desired area using the △/▼ button and press the OK button.

### **4.2.4 TV SCART**

- You can set the TV SCART of video output.
  - 1. Select TV SCART using the ▲/▼ button.
  - 2. Select RGB or CVBS using **◄/▶** Button.

# 4.2.5 Audio Language

- You can select Audio Language.
  - 1. Select Audio Language using the ▲/▼ buttons.
  - 2. Select your desired Audio Language using **◄/▶** button, or press the OK button to display the available list.
  - 3. When you press the OK button, Select your desired Audio Language using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK button.

# 4.2.6 Quick Installation

 You can select Quick Installation to complete the Installation Wizard Settings.

### 4.2.7 Search

You can configure installation settings and search for channels.

# 4.3 Search



This chapter provides how to get the channels by search.

### 4.3.1 LNB Control

- To scan channels, you must select the correct LNB type that you have on your dish. You can change the LNB Type by using the 4/▶ button.
  - 1. Select LNB Control using the ▲/▼ buttons.
  - 2. Select among DiSEqC / Tone Burst / No DiSEqC using ◀/▶ button, or press the OK button to display the available list.
  - 3. When you press the OK button, Select your desired LNB Control using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK button

Note >>>

If the DiSEqC does not exist then select No DiSEqC.

# 4.3.2 Satellite Setting

- If LNB Control was set up, you can set the satellite name into Satellite A ~ D.
  - 1. Select Satellite A ~ D using the ▲/▼ button.
  - Select one satellite among the list using the ◄/▶ button, or press the OK button to display the available list.
  - 3. When you press the OK button, Select your desired satellite name using the ▲/▼ Button and press the OK button

# 4.3.3 Continue

 If LNB Control and Satellite A ~ D were set up, Select the Continue using the ▲/▼ Button, and press the OK button to start the searching process.

# 5. Basic Operation

This chapter describes functions such as Switching Channel, Volume Control, and basic features for watching programs.

# 5.1 Switching Channel

- You can change channels by:
  - Pressing the **△/**▼ or CH **△/**▼ Buttons.
  - Entering the channel number using the NUMERICAL (0-9).
  - Press the TV/RADIO button to switch between TV and Radio channels.

#### Note >>>

You can also change channels using the channel list or program guide.

### 5.2 Volume Control

You can adjust the audio volume.



- Press the VOL + / buttons to adjust the audio volume.
- Press the MUTE button to stop the audio temporarily
- Press the MUTE button again to restore the sound to previous level.

# 5.3 Resolution



You can set the resolution of the screen. Press the V-FORMAT button while watching a program. The current resolution will be displayed. Each time you press the V-FORMAT button. The resolution changes in the following sequence: 576i -> 576p -> 720p -> 1080i->576i.

# 5.4 Audio Menu



- If multiple Audio Track / Channel are available, you can select the one.
  - 1. Press the AUDIO button.
  - 2. Select the Audio Track using the **◄/▶** Button.
  - 3. Select the Audio Channel ( Stereo, Mono, Mono(LL), Mono(RR) ) using the ◀/▶ Button.
  - 4. Press the FXIT button to close.

# 5.5 Subtitle Menu



- If multiple subtitle languages are available, you can select the one.
  - 1. Press the SUBTITLE button.
  - 2. Select the subtitle using the **◄/▶** or**▲/▼** button and press the OK button.

#### 5.6 Teletext



- If your chosen channel has digital teletext features, you can access them.
  - 1. Press the TELETEXT button.
  - 2. Press the TELETEXT button again to return to normal viewing.

# 5.7 Program Information



■ You can view the Program Information by pressing the Info button while watching a program. Press the EXIT button to hide the Program Information. You can see detailed information about the current program. Press the Info button where Program Information is displayed to view detailed information.

Note >>>

Press the Info button again to hide the Program Information box.

#### 5.8 Channel List

- This chapter will help you use the various channel lists available.
  - 1. Press the OK button while watching a program to display the channel list,
  - 2. Select your desired channel using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK button to change the channel.

Note >>>

Press the EXIT button to remove the channels list.

Press the INFO button to display the channel Information

#### 5.8.1 All List



- You can sort channels by channel No. (Numeric).
  - 1. Press the OK button while watching a program to display the channel list.
  - 2. Press the RED button to sort channel by channel No.

# 5.8.2 Alphabet List



- You can sort channels by alphabet list.
- Press the OK button while watching a program to display the channel list
- 2. Press the GREEN button to display the alphabet list
- 3. Press the GREEN button again and select a sub group using the ▲/▼ Button

# 5.8.3 Network List



- You can sort channels by network list.
- 1. Press the OK button while watching a program to display the channel list.
- 2. Press the YELLOW button to display the network list.
- 3. Press the YELLOW button again and select a sub group using the ▲/▼ Button.

#### 5.8.4 Satellite List



- You can sort channels by Satellite group.
- 1. Press the OK button while watching a program to display the channel list.
- 2. Press the BLUE button to display the Satellite groups.
- 3. Press the BLUE button again and select a sub group using the ▲/▼ button.

#### 5.8.5 Favorite List



- You can sort channels by favorite group.
- 1. Press the OK button while watching a program to display the channel list.
- 2. Press the FAV button to display the favorite groups.
- 3. Press the FAV button again and select a sub group using the ▲/▼ Button.

# 5.8.6 Package List



- You can sort channels by Package.
   (E.g. SD, HD, Movie, News, Show, Sports, Children, etc)
- 1. Press the OK button while watching a program to display the channel list.
- 2. Press the OPT button to display the package list.
- 3. Press the OPT button again and select a sub group using the ▲/▼ button.

# 6. Time Shifted Recording (TSR)

Your PVR automatically saves the program on air in the external usb hard disk temporarily, so that users can watch programs as they watch a video tape using functions such as Pause, Rewind, Fast Forward and Slow Motion.

#### 6.1 Pause



If you press the PAUSE button on the remote controller, the current program is paused. If you press the PLAY button, the program is resumed from that point.

#### Note >>>

Pause makes the time difference or delay between the broadcasting point and watching point. The time difference is equal to the paused time period. You can check the time difference in the Time bar (TSR Time). Other operations such as slow motion and rewind also make the time difference. Press the STOP button to remove the time difference, and watch the program on air presently.

### 6.2 Rewind



Press the REWIND button on the remote controller to watch the scene passed by. Whenever you press the REWIND button, the rewind speed increases by 2 steps. (x2, x4). If you press the PLAY button, the rewinding operation stops, and the program is played at normal speed.

#### Note >>>

You can rewind to the point when you have changed to the current channel. If the watching point reaches the start point during rewinding, the program is automatically played at normal speed from the point.

### 6.3 Fast Forward



Press the FORWARD button on the remote controller to fast forward the program. Whenever you press the FORWARD button, the speed increases by 2 steps. (x2, x4)

If you press the PLAY button, the fast forward operation is stops, and the program is played at normal speed.

#### Note >>>

You can use the fast forward operation only when there is a time difference between the current watching and the broadcasting point caused by some previous operations such as pause, slow motion, and rewind. You can fast forward to the current broadcasting point. If the watching point reaches to the broadcasting point, the program is automatically played at normal speed.

# 6.4 Slow Motion



Press the SLOW MOTION button to play the current program in slow motion mode.

Whenever you press the SLOW MOTION button, the speed decreases by 3 steps. (x1/2, x1/4, x1/8) Press the PLAY button to stop playing in slow motion and play the program at normal speed.

# 7. Recording and Playback a Recorded Service

Since this receiver connected with external usb hard disk, you can record a program without an external media device such as a VCR.

#### Note >>>

- You must connect a hard disk drive to the USB port on the back of the digital receiver before everything. The hard disk drive should have its own power supply because the digital receiver cannot supply power enought to drive it through the USB port
- The USB memory stick which speed is slow does not support.

# 7.1 Instant Recording



 Press the RECORD button on the remote controller to record the current program instantly.

#### Notice >>>

- Ensure that there is enough free space before recording, because if the free space on the hard disk drive is insufficient, recording will stop. Recording 1 hour of program may require up to 3GB of free space of hard disk space. The space for recording 1 hour of program may be different depending on the program recorded.
- You can record radio programs with this receiver.

# 7.2 Recording Reservation



- You can reserve recording to record your desired program automatically. You can reserve recording of program using Program Guide.
  - 1. Press the GUIDE button.
  - 2. Select Program using the △/▼button and press the RED button.

# 7.3 Playback Recording File



- 1. Press the RECORD LIST button.
- 2. Select the desired program to playback using the ▲/▼ button, and then press the OK button to playback the program.
- 3. Press the STOP button to stop the current program, and watch the Recording List.
- 4. You can perform time shift operation like VCR functions such as rewind, formard, slow motion, pause, skip, and replay using the playback control or the additional buttons on the remote controller while you are playing back a program.

#### 7.4 Bookmark

You can mark favorite parts of a recording by creating bookmark. and then jump to them.

# 7.4.1 Adding Bookmark



- You can jump to a position directly using the bookmark feature in recorded file playback. Use bookmarks to search a specific scene quickly and conveniently.
- Press the ADD BOOKMARK button at the location you want to set a bookmark while playing back a recorded file.

# 7.4.2 Bookmark List



- 1. Press the BOOKMARK LIST button after adding a bookmark.
- 2. Select the location you wish to view using the ▲/▼button, and press the OK button..
- 3. Press the EXIT button to return to the play bar.
- 4. To delete a location, select the location you want to delete and press the RED button.

# 8. Program Guide

The Program Guide displays program information about each channel, based on the date and time. You can also schedule your recording using the information given.

1. Press the GUIDE button.

Note >>>

Press the MENU, EXIT or GUIDE button to exit the Guide screen.

# 8.1 Program Guide Information



- You can view program information for all channels.
  - 1. Move to previous or next program within the same channel using the △/▼ Button.
  - 2. Move to the previous / next day using the GREEN / YELLOW button.
- 3. Press the OK button in the selected program to view detailed Information for the selected program.
- 4. Select your desired program from left column, and then move the cursor using the ◄/► or ▲/▼ Button and press the OK button. Then you can watch the program if it is on air,

# 8.2 Record

- You can automatically reserve your desired program by selecting the scheduled program and pressing the RED button.
  - Select the desired program and press the RED button to complete reservation.
  - 2. This icon (Reservation Icon) will be displayed.

# 8.3 Timer Reservation

- You can view the time when the receiver is automatically recording.
  - 1. Press the BLUE button to display the Timer Reservation List.

# 9. Menu Operation

You can set General Settings, Installation, Channel Edit, Common Interface, PVR, and all other items suitable for your environment.

#### Note >>>

- Press the BACK button to save the changes and return to the previous menu.
- Press the MENU button to exit the Menu screen.

# 9.1 General Settings



• In this chapter you can set options for User Settings, TV Settings, Parental Control, Time settings, Timer Settings, Network, and System Information.

# 9.1.1 User Settings



- 1.Press the MENU button.
- 2.Select General Settings using the **◄/**▶button..
- 3.Select User Settings using the ▲/▼button, and press the OK button.

# 9.1.1.1 Menu Language

- You can set the language for Menu.
  - 1.Select Menu Language using the ▲/▼ button.
  - 2. Select your desired menu language using **◄/▶** button, or press the OK button to display the available Language List.
  - 3. When you press the OK button, Select your desired menu language using the ▲/▼ button in Language List, and press the OK button.

# 9.1.1.2 Primary Audio Language

- You can set the language for Primary Audio.
   Default language is English.
  - 1. Select Primary Audio Language using the ▲/▼ button.
  - Select your desired audio language using ◄/► button, or press the OK button to display the available Language List.
  - 3. When you press the OK button, Select your desired audio language using the ▲/▼ button in Language List, and press the OK button

# 9.1.1.3 Secondary Audio Language

- You can set the language for Secondary Audio. Default language is English.
  - 1. Select Secondary Audio Language using the ▲/▼ button.
  - 2. Select your desired audio language using ◀/▶ button, or press the OK button to display the available Language List.
  - 3. When you press the OK button, Select your desired audio language using the ▲/▼ button in Language List, and press the OK button.

# 9.1.1.4 Subtitles

- You can set the Subtitle ON/OFF
  - 1. Select Subtitles using the ▲/▼ button.
  - 2. Select ON or OFF using **◄/▶** button for subtitle.

# 9.1.1.5 Subtitle Language

- You can set the language for Subtitle. Default language is English.
- You can only set Subtitle Language if ON is selected in the Subtitles menu item
  - 1. Select Subtitle Language using the ▲/▼ button.

- 2. Select your desired subtitle language using the ◀/▶ button, or press the OK button to display the available Language List.
- 3. When you press the OK button, Select your desired subtitle language using the ▲/▼ button in Language List, and press the OK button.

# 9.1.1.6 Transparency

- You can set the transparency. Default value is 100%.
  - 1. Select Transparency using the ▲/▼ button.
  - 2. Select your desired transparency using **◄/▶** Button.

### 9.1.1.7 OSD Info Time Limit

- You can set the time for OSD info. Default time is 5 second.
  - 1. Select OSD Info time limit using the ▲/▼ button.
  - 2. Select your desired time using **◄/▶** Button.

# 9.1.2 TV Settings



- You can set TV output.
  - 1. Press the MENU button.
  - 2. Select General Settings using the **◄/▶** button.
  - 3. Select TV Settings using the ▲/▼ button, and press the OK button.

# 9.1.2.1 TV SCART

- You can set the TV SCART of video output.
  - 1. Select TV SCART using the ▲/▼ button.
  - 2. Select RGB or CVBS using **◄/▶** Button.

#### 9.1.2.2 Screen Format

- You can set the Screen Format of video output.
  - 1. Select Screen Format using the ▲/▼ button.
  - 2. Select 4:3 or 16:9 using **◄/▶** Button.

# 9.1.2.3 Format Adjustment

- You can set the Format adjustment of your TV.
  - 1. Select Format adjustment using the ▲/▼ button.
  - 2. When choosing 4:3 as Screen Format, Select among Auto, Zoom and Letterbox using ◀/▶ Button.
  - 3. When choosing 16:9 as Screen Format, Select among Auto, Zoom and Pillar box using ◀/▶ button.

# 9.1.3Parental Control



- You can set access control for each program and menu. You can also change your PIN.
  - 1. Press the MFNU button.
  - 2. Select General Settings using the **◄/▶** Button.
  - 3. Select Parental Control using the ▲/▼ button, and press the OK button.
- 4. When prompting message is displayed to ask PIN, Enter the PIN using the NUMERICAL (0~9) buttons.

Note >>>

The Default PIN is 0 0 0 0.

# 9.1.3.1 Receiver Lock

- You cannot use the digital receiver until you have entered a PIN code.
  - 1. Select Receiver Lock using the ▲/▼ Button.
  - 2. Select On or Off using the **◄/**▶ button.

#### 9.1.3.2 Installation Lock

- You cannot use the installation menu until you have entered a PIN code
  - 1. Select Installation Lock using the ▲/▼ Button
  - 2. Select On or Off using the **◄/▶** button

# 9.1.3.3 Channel Edit Lock

- You cannot use the channel edit menu until you have entered a PIN code.
  - 1. Select Channel Edit Lock using the ▲/▼ Button
  - 2. Select On or Off using the **◄/**▶button

# 9.1.3.4 Recording List Lock

- You cannot use the recording list menu until you have entered a PIN code.
  - 1. Select Recording List Lock using the ▲/▼ Button.
  - 2. Select On or Off using the **◄/▶** button

# 9.1.3.5 Change Password

- You can change the current password into new one.
  - 1. Select Change Password using the ▲/▼ button, and press the OK button.
  - 2. Enter Current Password using the NUMERICAL (0-9) button

- 3. Enter New Password using the NUMERICAL (0-9) button
- 4. Enter New Password again to confirm the Verify Password

#### Note >>>

The Default Password is 0 0 0 0. If you have forgotten your Password, please contact your local receiver distributor.

# 9.1.4 Time Setting



- You can set Time.
  - 1. Press the MENU button.
  - Select the General Settings using the ◄/► Button.
  - 3. Select the Time Setting using the ▲/▼ button, and press the OK button.

# 10. Software Upgrade

## 10.1 From a USB memory

If you have a USB memory stick, you can update the firmware from it by performing the following steps:

- 1. Download a new firmware from the \_\_\_\_\_\_.
- 2. Copy the firmware file to your USB memory stick.
- 3. Insert the USB memory stick into the USB port on the back panel of the digital receiver.
- 4. Press the MENU button.
- 5. Select the General Settings using the  $\triangleleft/\triangleright$  Button.
- 6. Select the System Information using the ▲/▼ button, and press the OK button.
- 7. Press the RED button.
- 8. When prompting message is displayed to ask PIN, Enter the PIN using the NUMERICAL (0 $\sim$ 9) buttons.
